
2015 Top Lop Youth Winners





$7 \sim \text{Five Pines Hope} - \text{FP60}$ Bred and owned by Brenna White, IN


I would like to thank everyone who has helped me achieve having a Top Lop this year. I am honored.

8 ~ JC'S Sweet-N-Spicy - LP2


8 ~ JC'S Sweet-N-Spicy – LP2 Bred and owned by Jacey Royer, MI


