Youth Director Guidelines

Criteria to applying for and fulfill the duties of this HLRSC position are as follows:

Any current Youth Member of the HLRSC can apply for a Zone Director Position. Any Youth HLRSC Member that is interested in a Youth Zone Director position must submit a Youth Director Candidate Form, to the Youth Chair no later than May 15th of the year prior to appointment. The Youth Directors of Zones 1, 3, 5, 7, & 9 shall be appointed on odd years. The Youth Directors from Zones 2, 4, 6, and 8 shall be appointed on even years. The terms of office of those appointed shall begin immediately at the end of the close of the annual ARBA Convention.

On the nineteenth (19th) birthday of a Youth Director, a new Youth Director will be appointed, as the Director is now considered adult per the HLRSC. The term of office for all Youth Directors shall be two (2) years unless no other candidate is nominated or interested. Vacancies in any office shall be filled by appointment of the Youth Chair, subject to the approval of the President.

Youth Directors who fail to fulfill the obligations of duties of office or shows lack of interest in Club matters risk removal from office by the Youth Chair, subject to the approval of the President. Any Youth Director who becomes delinquent in making payment of membership dues shall be notified by the Secretary by Certified Mail, return receipt requested, signed only by the addressee. If the Youth Director fails to renew within thirty (30) days, the Youth Chair shall be notified, and the office held by the Youth Director shall be declared vacant. If a Youth Director moves his/her residence to a geographical area other than and outside the one s/he was elected to represent, s/he shall voluntarily resign office. If s/he fails to do so, the Youth Chair shall declare the office vacant. If a Youth Director shall give up breeding of Holland Lop rabbits during his/her term, s/he shall voluntarily resign office. If s/he fails to do so, the Youth Chair shall declare the office vacant.

Guidelines for fulfilling the duties of this HLRSC position are as follows:

Each Youth Director will work directly with the Youth Chair and the adult Zone Director of their zone. Each Youth Zone Director should read and become familiar with the HLRSC Constitution, By-laws, and all club guidelines.

Youth Directors shall make quarterly reports in the Hollander to the membership. No BOB/BOS information will be included in this report. The Youth Director is to submit their Zone report to the Hollander Editor in a consistent and timely manner. If for any reason they are unable to submit a report, they are to contact both the Youth Chair and Hollander Editor before the deadline. If two (2) quarterly Hollander reports are missed, the Youth Director may be replaced at the discretion of the Youth Chair, subject to the approval of the President.

The Youth Director should actively seek feedback from members in their Zone on issues pertaining to the club. They should solicit new club members and assist new members whenever possible. Bullying is strictly prohibited and will not be tolerated.

The Youth Director should assist the HLRSC in some way at the ARBA Convention.
