HLRSC Royalty Application Questions:

Introduction and Background (10 pts)

1. When did you join the HLRSC and how many consecutive years have you belonged? Explain any lapses in membership.
2. Explain how and why you got started in your project. Include the year and how others helped you get started.

Involvement and Leadership (30 pts)

3. Explain why you chose to raise hollands.
4. How have you been a leader in your project?
5. What have you done to promote hollands and make others aware of your project?
6. Give 2-3 examples where you've personally helped another exhibitor at a show or rabbit event. Describe the circumstance and what you learned in the process.

Herd Management (30 pts)

7. Describe the housing & equipment for your animals. Be very specific.
8. What specifically do you do to help with the care and upkeep of your project?
9. Describe the records you keep and how you keep them.

Plans and Goals (30 pts)

10. What award or achievement has an animal from your herd earned that makes you most proud and why?
11. What are your goals for your project and what are your personal goals? What goals have you achieved to this point?
12. What are some setbacks or struggles that you have faced within your project(s) or goals? What have you done to overcome those setbacks? Do you plan to make any changes in your project to achieve your goals?
13. How do you feel your project will help you in your future endeavors?

Hollander Bio:

If you win this award, a short description of your achievements will be submitted to the Hollander. In a separate document, write what you would like (in first-person narrative) to be printed in 300-600 words and upload it separately from your application. Please note: This does not count toward your page count. Failure to include this bio will result in a 20-point deduction.
